Caroline's eclectic career spans the worlds of theatre and opera director, choreographer, actor and artistic director of the award-winning company Feelgood Theatre Productions. Most recently their UK/French tour of *Not About Heroes* (MacDonald) transferring for a second successful run in the West End, London.

FTP was founded in 1994 and has created over 30 productions and award winning outreach projects.
